#### From the Pastor's Study

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I am writing this newsletter the morning after our Ash Wednesday service. As I made my way to church last night, as details of another



mass shooting were trickling in from news outlets, I received a text from a church member who wanted us to pray for the students, teachers, and families affected by this tragedy in Florida. I responded, "Absolutely!" But honestly, in my heart, I could hardly summon up the will to pray yet again for an atrocity we could be taking steps to prevent.

I know that our congregation would not be in absolute agreement about issues of gun control and gun freedom. However, regardless of what our opinions are, there should be no doubt about the convictions of Jesus and the Christian faith. Jesus did not endorse violence of any kind for any reason. Jesus did not advocate for war, even if it was for a seemingly just cause. Jesus did

not believe violence was an effective way to solve problems. There is only one passage in all of the gospel accounts where Jesus endorsed carrying weapons [Luke 22:36 & 38], but the moment one of those weapons was used to defend Jesus against arrest, Jesus immediately responded saying: "No more of this!" Jesus then healed the soldier who had been injured by a sword strike.

...Jesus went on to accept His own torture and death without a fight, and without an argument. Jesus did not practice self-defense, but rather self-sacrifice, believing that offering our lives, rather than the taking life, is the way of God and the way of peace.

There is no way Jesus would endorse, support, or affirm a culture that is awash in guns and that maintains a belief in redemptive violence - the use of deadly force to overcome evil. You may not agree with Jesus...but Christians should understand His position on weapons and the use of violence. Jesus chose to hang on a cross instead of swing a sword. That isn't an opinion, it is a fact.

Personally, while I agree with our constitutional rights to bear arms, I do not believe we should be able to possess weapons and armaments that allow an individual to slaughter innocent citizens on a massive scale. Careful background checks, diligent licensing practices, and gun regulations that limit assault-like weapons with high capacity magazines seem entirely reasonable to me, and even necessary.

In meeting with the leadership of CT against Gun Violence, I learned that the only thing we can do to promote reasonable gun regulation is to work at our state and local levels to ensure change. Congress does not have the votes nor the resolve to make meaningful alterations on a national level. While I am certain some members of our community will challenge this assertion and the assumed causality: the State of Connecticut has the second toughest gun regulations in

the country and the fifth lowest rate of gun deaths in the nation. For those who desire greater gun regulation, the only way forward is to advocate for and to vote to ensure that gun regulations remain strong in our state.

I suspect there are numerous variables that contribute to the frequency of mass shootings in our country: the proliferation of guns; the enormous consumption of entertainment - video games, films, and television that glorify violence; the woefully poor funding for research, treatment, and care of people who struggle with mental health concerns; and the development of an online and virtual culture that can exacerbate the deep loneliness and isolation that many people feel. Gun violence is a complex and often divisive issue in our country, and there no lone culprit to blame. But just because something is complicated, doesn't mean we shouldn't resolve to work toward a resolution. We can pray all we like, but change requires action.

And the best action each of us can take immediately is to choose to follow the ways of Jesus to the best of our ability choosing to act in love instead of hate, choosing to forgive instead of fight, and even choosing selfsacrifice over self-defense. That is not an easy path to take. It goes against our internal and intense survival instincts. But it may very well be the only way to save the world from the violence that continually threatens us.




